What are the key dates for the 2022 season?

Please Note:

1. Training will begin the week commencing 21st March, 2022
2. The training nights for older junior and 17s teams are scheduled so as to reduce the potential clashes with FNA representative teams training nights and after school sport.
3. Training days for some age groups have changed from previous years.
4. The proposed training times will continue at the same times each week during the season, subject to final team numbers and the appointment of coaches.
5. All training for 17s, 19s and Seniors will be held at Gibson Park in East Fremantle.
6. Training currently scheduled for Brentwood may change dependent on the timing of the court resurfacing.

**Please note that NetSetGo players will only need to pay the Netball WA & Netball AUS component once per year, paid for the first registered program.*

Why have the fees increased in 2022?

The fees have increased because Netball has made the decision to transition to a new system – PlayHQ. This has involved significant work and as a result there have been increases in the Netball WA and Netball AUS components of the fees.

Tingara and FNA have worked hard together to keep the increase in their components to a minimum, however they have no ability to influence the Netball WA and Netball AUS components.

Grading Information for 2022

Is attendance at grading compulsory?

Participation at the Club's grading trials is compulsory, unless there are special extenuating circumstances. Any absence must be communicated in writing to the Grading Coordinator prior to the commencement of grading trials, however, please note that absences may be taken into account when team placement is considered.

When are the grading trials for 2022?

The below table summarises the grading trial schedule for 2022:

All grading will take place at the FNA courts – this includes the junior grades due to court resurfacing at Brentwood.

Set (2014 and 2015) will have a session closer to the beginning of the season as they are not graded and would be just put into teams depending on friendships etc.

What is the grading process?

The Club grading process involves the following:

Grading Committee

- Player assessment during the last round of previous season whilst actively involved in competition
- Pre-season player assessment (as per dates above).

Coaches

- Assessment of player performance and commitment to training and development within their own team from the previous season.

Grading is based on year of birth, not school year, as per FNA and Netball WA requirements. A player who is younger than 18 and new to the Club must produce appropriate proof of age prior to taking the court at grading trials.

Every endeavour is made by the Grading Committee to place members appropriately in teams taking into consideration personal skills, application and team balance. We cannot guarantee to place you/your child with friends, with the exception of the Set H and I age group. If you choose to withdraw yourself/your child from the Club once registration has occurred, a portion, or all, of your fees may be **non-refundable** (at the discretion of the Executive Committee). Requests for withdrawals must be made in writing. However, any withdrawals made after the final date for submission of final Club lists to FNA (normally late May or early June) will result in no refunds of any nature.

Individual players (or their parents) in **the 17s and 19s grades only** may request to 'play up' to a senior grade, this request must be in writing and submitted to the Grading Coordinators at least 2 weeks prior to the commencement of the grading period.

Individual players (or their parents) may request to 'play down' to a lower grade where a legitimate reason exists such as physical capacity or disability. This request must be in writing and submitted to the Grading Coordinator at least 2 weeks prior to the commencement of the registration period. Players will need to provide relevant medical evidence for assessment. It should be noted that the final assessment will be determined by Fremantle Netball Association, not Tingara.

Can players change grades once the grading trials conclude?

Once a player is graded and the teams announced, the Club's policy is not to move that player to another team, other than where there are exceptional circumstances (eg where a player is seriously injured and this requires another player to be moved). Players and/or Parents MUST NOT make requests for review of their or their child's grading. To allow such a review would bring unnecessary complexity, uncertainty and instability to the Club grading processes. All teams are submitted to FNA with Tingara's grading request. The grade of the team is then decided upon by FNA.

How are team lists communicated?

Team announcements will take place by email.

What is the process for applications for Preformed Teams (Seniors only)?

Tingara Netball club strongly supports a lifelong enjoyment of netball for all players. The grading committee will consider applications from **senior players only** for full preformed teams and also requests for smaller numbers of players to play together. Please note this is only available for current or past Tingara Netball club players.

This will likely be Senior Team 4 or below. A preformed team must consist of 8-9 players of similar playing ability. If the team requires a coach, a coach must be provided for by the team. The team must be prepared to participate in the two-week grading process at the discretion of the Grading Coordinator.

Applications for preformed teams and other requests must be made to the Grading Coordinator by email as early as possible and at the latest by the close of registrations. If there are any questions prior to a request application, please contact the Grading Coordinator to discuss. Confirmation of whether a team has been accepted will be given prior to grading commencing. Requests for smaller numbers of players to play together will be considered during the grading process. Why is Tingara changing their uniforms?

In keeping with promoting inclusivity at Tingara, we are looking to expand our range of options for playing uniforms for 2022 and beyond.

We are working with our supplier to keep close to our current design but add the option to play in a dress or shorts and top as well as our current skirt and top uniform. This would mean in any team; each individual player could choose to wear any of the 3 options.

Do I have to purchase the new uniform for 2022?

The 2022 season will be a transition season where players can wear the current or new uniform. Transition to the new uniform will be compulsory for the 2023 season.

Can I play in my NetSetGo shirt?

No, all NetSetGo players are required to order a Tingara Netball club uniform – this is also made clear during the online registration process.

Coaching in 2022

How does Tingara arrange coaches for the teams?

Tingara encourages parents and players to register as coaches. No previous experience is required, and coaches are appointed following discussions with the Coaching Coordinator after grading of the players has been finalised. The following support is provided to our coaches:

- Regular pre-season and in-season coaching clinics run by experienced Tingara and external coaches
- Partial reimbursement of costs associated with a Netball Australia coach accreditation course upon successful completion of the course
- Coaching updates, tips and training ideas
- Mentoring by experienced Tingara coaches if requested
- Assistant coaching opportunities for those wanting to embark on coaching. Note that juniors are required to be an assistant coach prior to taking on a coaching role.
- Team Manager for each team will assist with administrative duties and equipment
- Re-imburement of a portion of Tingara's registration fees for players who volunteer to coach
- Secondary School students coaching at Tingara are eligible for community service hours

Will I need a Working with Children check?

Coaches of players under the age of 18 must obtain a Working with Children Check if they are over 18 years old and not a parent of a Tingara player under the age of 18.
